Overview

Eesti Vabariik (Eesti) is a small, highly developed country in Northern Europe. It has a population of approximately 1.3 million people.

The country's economy is highly developed and based on services, with a GDP of approximately 22.2 billion euros.

The country's main industries are information and communication technology, pharmaceuticals, and machinery. It has a high life expectancy of 81.5 years and a literacy rate of 99.5%.

The country's main cities are Tallinn, Tartu, and Pärnu. It has a total area of 45,227 square kilometers and a population density of 50 people per square kilometer.

Where is Estonia located?

Situated in northeastern Europe, Estonia juts out into the Baltic Sea, which surrounds the country to the north and west. To the east Estonia is bounded by Russia—predominantly by the Narva River and Lakes Peipus (Peipsi; Russian: Chudskoye Ozero), Tyoploye, and Pskov—and to the south it is bounded by Latvia.

How is Estonia classified?

Various sources classify Estonia differently for statistical and other purposes. For example, the United Nations [18] and Eurovoc [19] classify Estonia as part of Northern Europe, the OECD [20] classifies it as a Central and Eastern European country, the CIA World Factbook [21] classifies it as Eastern Europe.

How many people live in Estonia?

Estonia has a population of 1.3 million people (in 2015). Capital and largest city is Tallinn, spoken languages are Estonian (a Finnic language; official), Russian and some Swedish and Finnish. Eastern Europe country bordering the Baltic Sea and Gulf of Finland, between Latvia and Russia.

The capital city is Tallinn. Estonia's neighbors are Sweden, Finland, Russia and Latvia. Its population is 1,332,893. The territory of Estonia has the mainland and 2,222 islands in the Baltic Sea. People have lived in Estonia since at least 9,000 BC.

Is Estonia a developed country?

Estonia is a developed country with a high-income advanced economy. It is a democratic unitary parliamentary republic, administratively subdivided into 15 maakond (counties). It is one of the least populous members of the European Union and NATO.

What are some key dates in Estonia's history?

Some key dates in Estonia's history: 1918 - Independence proclaimed. 1920 - Peace treaty with Russia signed. 1934 - Prime Minister Konstantin Pats leads bloodless coup and establishes authoritarian rule. 1939 - World War Two: The Soviet Union compels Estonia to accept Soviet military bases.

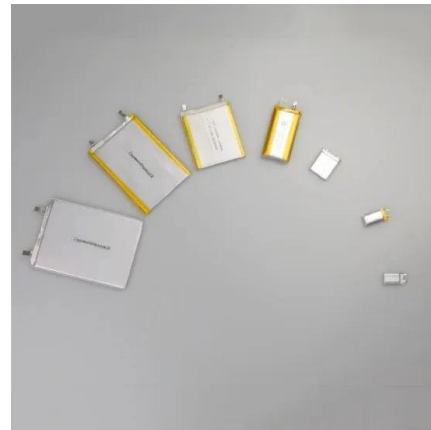

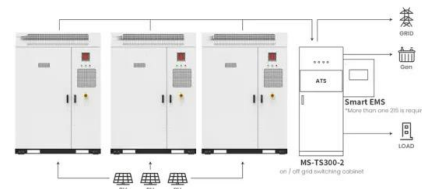

Application scenarios of energy storage battery products

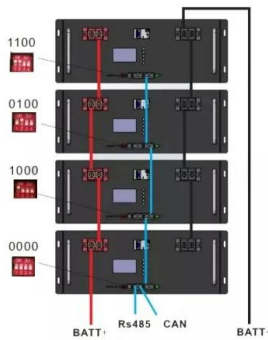
