Overview

Where is Malawi's first solar power plant located?

The centrally located facility is Malawi's first solar power plant connected to the national grid, a project successfully completed under a public-private partnership (PPP). The President of the Republic of Malawi Lazarus McCarthy Chakwera visited the Salima district, 101 km from the capital Lilongwe, on November 16, 2021.

Is Malawi a good place to invest in solar energy?

“Salima Solar is the first solar PV plant in Malawi to be connected to the national grid. As such, it is a model for future projects in several ways. In particular, it demonstrates that Malawi is an attractive destination for private sector investment in energy,” says President Lazarus McCarthy Chakwera at the plant’s inauguration ceremony.

How many MW of electricity is available in Malawi?

The Electricity Generation Company (Malawi) Limited (EGENCO) has an installed generation capacity of 406.6 MW out of which 335.15 MW is available. There has been a loss of about 165MW due to environmental degradation in the Shire River catchment area leading to low water levels and trash accumulation at hydro power plants.

Are photovoltaic and wind based energy systems feasible in Malawi?

This paper presents the technical and economic feasibility of photovoltaic and wind based energy system relative to existing diesel generators which are scheduled for only 14 hours per day for Likoma Island grid in Malawi.

Does Malawi have a reliable and quality power supply?

The paper provides initial data for investment decision making.

INTRODUCTION Malawi continues to struggle to offer reliable and quality power supply. The Electricity Generation Company (Malawi) Limited (EGENCO)

has an installed generation capacity of 406.6 MW out of which 335.15 MW is available.

Why is electricity supply in Malawi unreliable?

Only 8 per cent of the population in Malawi have access to electricity but installed capacity of electricity generation is lower than demand. This leads to load shedding by the electricity supplier; consequently electricity supply in Malawi is unreliable and micro and macroeconomic activities are significantly affected.

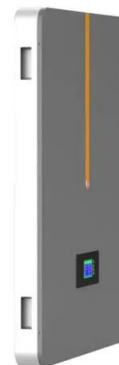

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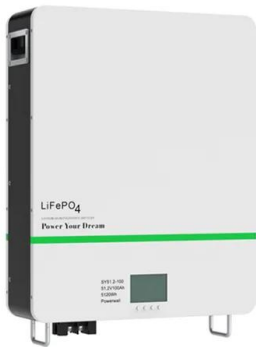

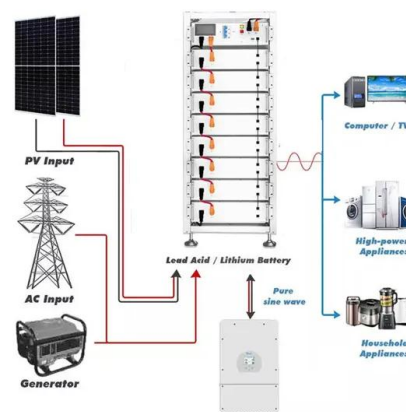
